Welcome!

Welcome to Miami Beach and the National Conference on Child Health Psychology, sponsored by the *Society of Pediatric Psychology*, Division 54 of the American Psychological Association, and hosted by the University of Miami Departments of Psychology and Pediatrics. Our goal is to bring you relevant, state of the art research. We hope that what you learn at the conference will be useful to you in your research and clinical endeavors.

We continue the tradition of mixing good science with time for socializing and fun. The following information contains important details about the conference that should help you navigate the schedule for a complete and enjoyable experience.

For exercise, each morning there is an optional activity (yoga, fun walk/run) at 7 am (meet at the pool area); on Friday afternoon there will be a salsa demonstration and lesson, also by the pool.

Our opening session on Thursday (7 - 9 pm) is an evening poster session/reception in the Starlight Ballroom on the top floor of the hotel. The main plenary sessions will begin on Friday and Saturday mornings at 9:00 am in the Mediterranean Ballroom. Please join us for a continental breakfast served prior to the morning plenary sessions.

The morning plenary sessions on Friday and Saturday also will be preceded by student programming and professional conversation hours, each from 8:00 to 9:00 am, in the smaller breakout rooms. deliver the Lizette Peterson Homer Memorial Keynote Address on *Public Policy and Child Health*, and this will be followed immediately by a cocktail reception in the Starlight Ballroom at 6:30 pm.

On Saturday, the early afternoon plenary session begins at 1:30 pm. Optional programming continues from 3:30 to 5:30 pm with sessions on *Management of Disorders of Sex Development*, and on *Ethics*; these optional sessions are scheduled in the breakout rooms.

For professionals who have registered for Continuing Education (CE) credits, they will be available for each of the four main plenary sessions, the Lizette Peterson-Homer Memorial Keynote Lecture, and the Saturday afternoon optional sessions.
